Number bonds

Number bonds to 10 - Practice the pairs of numbers that go together to make 10. The children need to know the 4 number sentences that go with each pair. These should become automated responses for the children.

For example:

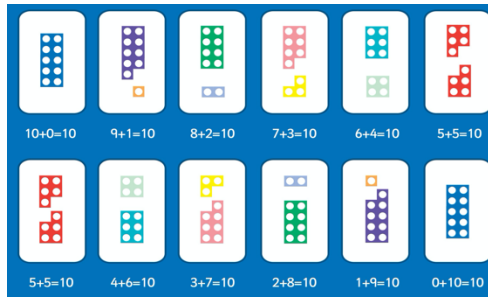
2 and 8

$$2 + 8 = 10$$

$$8 + 2 = 10$$

$$10 - 2 = 8$$

$$10 - 8 = 2$$



Ship Building

Christopher Columbus was a famous explorer and navigated across the sea on a boat that might have looked a little bit like this:



These special boats called caravels were very popular for exploring in the past because they were quite small, light and sailed well using the wind.

Your challenge this week is to use Christopher Columbus' boat to inspire you to make your own boat using materials in your house! Follow the instructions below:

1. First think about the important things your boat will need to have. Design your boat thinking about the key features. For example, how will your boat stay dry? How will your boat float not sink?
2. Now collect materials! Check with your parents what junk modelling you can use from your house. Yogurt pots, boxes, foil, cling film, old cloth, cardboard packaging etc.
3. Then use your design to start building your boat.
4. Add your finishing touches like a sail and a flag (and maybe some lego people for explorers!).
5. Finally, it's time to set sail! Use a paddling pool/bath/sink to create a big ocean to explore and see if your boat will float.
6. Create a storm for your boat using sponges/buckets of water. Is your boat waterproof? Is it strong enough to withstand a storm and make it all the way to America like Columbus' boat?
