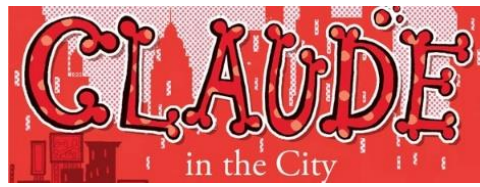
Here are the learning activities that I'd like you to complete this week please:

Maths	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Complete this week's BBC Bitesize Year 2 Maths daily lesson: - You could use the resources on White Rose to help you:
English: Claude in the City 	<p>This week is our last week of Claude in the City. We are going to work towards writing our own version of the story. This week's powerpoint is here.</p> <p>Lesson 1 – Read the whole story using the Claude video. Answer comprehension questions on PowerPoint or print out the sheet below.</p> <p>Lesson 2- Plan a version of the story: Another adventure in the city for Claude. Could he be in London? Could he visit some of the places here with Sir Bobblysock? Could there be another crime that Claude accidentally helps with? Complete the planning sheet on the PowerPoint.</p> <p>Lesson 3+4- Write a draft of your story over the next two days. Use your plan to help. Refer to the PowerPoint for guidance of what should be included in your story. Edit your work using a dictionary and thesaurus.</p> <p>Lesson 5- Fold up a few sheets of paper or use a notebook to make book and create your own Claude in the City book with illustrations. It could be called Claude in London or Claude in Museum depending on the story you choose to write.</p>

Reading	Please read for 15 minutes every day. Write a reading log for each day. If you need more books there are lots of online books, please check out the Reading Blog on the school website.
Topic Tasks: History 	<p>This week we begin our History topic about the Great Fire of London. Use this PowerPoint to help.</p> <p>Task 1 –Compare modern London to London in 1666. This video is a great animation of what London would have looked like. I would suggest watching it from 47 seconds for the children, as there is a scene of some people that look like they have the plague a bit before then that might be a bit scary and I wouldn't show this part at school, but you can decide for yourselves. Paint or colour background full of fire colours and Fire shapes. Cut out a cityscape on black paper or black painted paper.
